Mayor Boswell called the meeting to order; a quorum was established. He stated a notice of the meeting was duly posted according to state law and the following proceedings were held.

Commissioner Victor Leal gave the invocation.

Pledge of Allegiance/Welcome

Mayor Boswell led the Pledge of Allegiance and welcomed everyone in attendance.

1) Public Announcement of Events

- a) Danny Hoehne, President of the Rio Grande Valley Birding Festival stated the November Festival was a huge success. Surveys were conducted and positive comments and feedback were received from the vendors at the festival. Vendors came from around the country and internationally to participate in this event. He thanked the volunteers who helped make the event a great success and looked forward for the November 2013, "20th Annual RGV Birding Festival." Mr. Hoehne presented the 2012-19th Annual RGV Birding Festival Poster Frame to the City for its' participation and sponsorship in this event.

3) Presentation of proclamations proclaiming the following:

Mayor Boswell read and presented the following proclamations.

a) Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week – February 7-14, 2013

Mayor Pro-Tem Leftwich reported the Neighborhood Clean Sweep was held on February 2, 2013; 9.26 tons debris and 105 tires were collected in District 2. Members of the Marine Military Academy, Darrell B. Hester Juvenile Detention Center and City staff for assisting in this event. He invited the public to participate in the Neighborhood Clean Sweep.

Ken Clark, Planning and Zoning Director introduced Professors Murad Abuslim and Erik Diaz and recognized the architectural students.

Professor Abuslim gave a power point presentation of the studies and surveys the architectural students had conducted around the downtown district for possible downtown infill projects.

Mayor Boswell stated Valley International Airport had been working on designating the airport as a United States Customs and Border Patrol Airport. This would facilitate commerce; efficient international flow of passengers and goods; Private flyers would have more connecting options on commercial carriers for travel to interior U.S. points.

11) Consider and take action to authorize the staff to proceed with the installation of a speed hump on "B" Street between Lafayette Avenue and Austin Street as a "demonstration project" on a trial basis.

Javier M. Zamora, City Engineer stated staff was requesting permission to install the speed humps on "B" Street near Zavala Elementary. Staff met with School superintendent and school officials and there were no objections. This would be for demonstration purposes only to consider at other locations in the future. He recommended approval of the request.

Motion was made by Mayor Pro-Tem Leftwich and seconded by Commissioner Mezmar to approve the demonstration project on a trial basis. Motion carried unanimously.

12) <u>Consider and take action to approve and adopt a resolution updating the City of Harlingen's Basic Emergency Management Plan.</u>

Motion was made by Commissioner Castillo and seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Leftwich to approve and adopt the resolution. Motion carried unanimously.

Consider and take action to approve and adopt a resolution authoring the City of Harlingen to enter into an interlocal agreement with Region VIII Education Services

Center to participate in purchasing cooperative known as The Interlocal Purchasing System (TIPS/TAPS) Program.

Dan Serna, Assistant City Manager stated this would allow the City to utilize another state purchasing network and recommended approval of the resolution.

Motion was made by Mayor Pro-Tem Leftwich and seconded by Commissioner Mezmar to approve the resolution. Motion carried unanimously.

14) Consider and take action to adopt a resolution in support of the University of Texas System Plan to create a new university by uniting the campuses of the UT-Pan American, UT-Brownsville and the Regional Academic Health Center at Brownsville, Harlingen, Edinburg and McAllen so as to make the new University eligible for funding from the Permanent University Fund.

Motion was made by Mayor Pro-Tem Leftwich and seconded by Commissioner Leal to approve the resolution in support of the University of Texas System Plan. Motion carried unanimously.

15) Consider and take action to appoint an official member to Amigos Del Valle, Inc. Board of Directors to replace the city's representative.

Motion was Made by Mayor- Pro-Tem Leftwich and seconded by Commissioner Mezmar to appoint Commissioner Victor Leal as the City's representative to Amigos Del Valle, Inc. Board of Directors. Motion carried unanimously.

Consider and take action to approve and adopt a resolution calling and order the May 11, 2013 General Election to elect one member for the position of Mayor at-Large; one member for City Commissioner District 1 and one member for City Commissioner District 2 and any and all other related election matter's.

Motion was made by Commissioner Mezmar and seconded by Commissioner Leal to approve and adopt the resolution as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

17) Consider and take action to approve or reject the renewed Fire Protection Contract with Cameron County Emergency Services District No. 1 for FY 12/13.

Michael J. Rinaldi highlighted the Fire Protection Contract between the City of Harlingen and Cameron County Emergency Services District No. 1 for year 2012/13. The proposed annual amount was \$179,766.32 to be paid in quarterly installments of \$44,941.58 on the following dates: December 31st, March 31st, June 30th and Sept. 30th. He recommended approval of the contract.

Motion was made by Commissioner Leal and seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Leftwich to approve the renewed contract between the City of Harlingen and Cameron County Emergency Services District No. 1. Motion carried unanimously.

Consider and take action to approve sixty day written Notice to terminate the Fire Protection Contract with Cameron County Emergency Services District No. 1 for FY 12/13 effective May 1st, 2013 and 120-day written notice that the City does not intend to renew nor negotiate a contract with the County to provide the same contracted services for FY 13/14.
